



Basic Health and Wellness Policy

GENERAL WELLNESS POLICIES

- Children must be symptom free from the following illnesses without medication for 24 hours before entering the ministry area: *(Children's temperatures will be taken upon entry into classrooms.)*
 - Conjunctivitis (pink eye or other eye infection)
 - Cold
 - Constant runny nose
 - Diarrhea
 - Fever of 100° Fahrenheit / 38° Celsius or higher
 - Hard or excessive cough
 - Lice
 - Open sores
 - Sore throat
 - Undiagnosed rashes
 - Vomiting
 - Wheezing or shortness of breath
- Families, children, or volunteers who have travelled to the restricted states within the last two weeks will be asked to stay at home to honor the quarantine requirements.
- If a child becomes ill or sick during ministry time, they will be immediately isolated from the group until the parent/guardian is contacted and arrives.
- Children's ministries will administer only Band-Aids and ice packs.
- Due to potential allergies among our children, outside food and drinks (other than water and baby formulas) will not be permitted in the ministry area with our prior approval.
- At this time, no snacks will be provided in any of the ministries.
- It is encouraged to wash your child's hands before entering the classroom. Hand sanitizer will be provided, if needed.
- Adults, as well as children, must wash their own hands after going to the restroom, at a sink or with hand sanitizer.
- Peanut butter and nut products should never be allowed in the ministry areas.
- An information card/form should be on file for all children, stating any allergies, dietary restrictions, and special needs.
- Parents should not go beyond the classroom doors.

BABES & TOTS

- Adults must wash their own hands after changing a diaper.
- A nursing mother's room is available upstairs in the Kidz Lounge and is cleaned weekly.
- Children should be retrieved immediately following classes and services.
- No solid food will be fed to babies during the service.

CLASSROOM PRECAUTIONS

- Volunteers will be required to wear masks. Disposable masks are available if needed.
- Elementary aged students are encouraged to wear a mask but it will not be enforced.
- Volunteers will re-sanitize each room after each service.
- Social distancing cannot be promised. However, we will try to maintain smaller groups in each classroom.
